## Organised off-days:

#### Wednesday 23 rd:

To introduce you "The Schelde", the river where the third race will take place on Friday, I have organised a day-out in Antwerp. First you will visit the Antwerp Zoo (info see below). This large boat will take you for a 50 minute trip on the river Schelde. There you can "sense" already a bit what our racers will do during their race on the 25 th.

### The tranquil spots

Looking for a bit of peace and quiet? Besides the parks, there are a lot of (often hidden) tranquil havens to be discovered in the city: inner courtyards, squares and gardens. The best-known oasis in the historic city centre is certainly Vlaeykensgang (Oude Koornmarkt 16). The Beguinage has a beautiful inner garden with an orchard and little pond, surrounded by cobble-stoned streets next to St. Cahtherine's Church. The Botanical Garden and its 2 000 noteworthy or rare plants can be found in Leopoldstraat. A greenhouse protects the cactuses and (sub)tropical plants..

**For the Children:** (this is also just a summary there are many more fun parks allover Belgium)

### Aquatopia

Aquatopia is a futuristic aquarium displaying a fascinating collection of tropical fish and unique water-dwelling creatures in high-tech surroundings.

Sharks, piranhas, stingrays and octopuses: in 'Aquatopia' nature is proud to show itself off in all its beauty and diversity. The fish and other sea creatures will take you on a marvelous voyage through a tropical rain forest, along rivers, underwater caves and coral reefs, to the depths of the ocean. In Aquatopia you will come across incredible and amazing sea creatures from the whole world.

#### Pirateneiland

Go on an exciting adventure with pirate Krikkebeen and explore the wild seas. Pirates' Island is housed in an old warehouse, which has been renovated and transformed into an indoor paradise for children aged from 2 to 12 years.

### Antwerp Zoo (next to Central station)

The Antwerp Zoo is one of the oldest and most famous zoos in the world. More than 5 000 animals await you here.

You must set aside at least half a day for a visit because there really is so much to see and do. Penguins in Vriesland, elephants and giraffes in a unique Egyptian temple and a brand new pink villa for the hippos, and their neighbours, the tapirs. The Antwerp Zoo buildings are home to more than 950 species and 5 000 animals.

The Antwerp Zoo has developed an international reputation because of its participation in international breeding programs for threatened species, such as the okapi, the bonobo, the Golden Lion Tamarin and the Congo peacock.

The beautiful, distinctive buildings and garden have been classified Its location - originally just outside the city walls, now an oasis of peace in the heart of the city, next door to Central Station - is typical of its nineteenth-century origins.

### **GENT (Ghent)**

Ghent is the fourth largest city of Belgium with about 250.000 inhabitants. There are many things to see and many places to visit in Ghent.

Here under you will find a summary of places in Ghent.

**Shopping**: in the vicinity of the Veldstraat, you will find all major stores.

#### Sight seeing:

#### Is Ghent the most beautiful city in Belgium?

In any case, a walking trip through the city will make clear that this city was a powerful center of trade and commerce. The citizens of the medieval city certainly did their best to turn Ghent into a rich showcase of beautiful civil gothic buildings.

#### The St Bayo Cathedral

It was named after Saint Bavo, a 7th century local nobleman who became a saint after he had given away his possessions to the poor and entered the monastery. The cathedral with its mighty uprising tower is perhaps the most visible sign of the pride of the citizens of Ghent.

The cathedral has a wealth of art treasures, including the monumental rococo pulpit by Laurent Delvaux (1745), the tombs of some Ghent bishops in the chancel, the Conversion of St. Bavo by Pieter Paul Rubens, and the world famous multi-section *The Mystic Lamb*. This altarpiece was painted by Hubert and Jan Van Eyck, by order of Judocus Vijdt, senior councillor of the City of Ghent. It was intended for the patron's own chapel and his wife Isabella Borluut and was completed in 1432. The Mystic Lamb has been transported abroad on several occasions, but, after the theft of two panels in 1934, it was transferred to the Christening Chapel for security.

Carriage trips through the ancient heart of the city can be made during the weekends, on public holidays and summer holidays from Easter till October between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

A boat excursion on the Ghent waterways

Both open and roofed-over boats leave at the Graslei and the Korenlei, the old Ghent port area, for a sightseeing tour through Ghent.

### **GENK**

**Genk** is a city and municipality located in the Belgian province of Limburg near Hasselt. The municipality only comprises the city of Genk itself. It is one of the most important industrial cities in Flanders, located on the Albert Canal, between Antwerp and Liège. Genk was recently voted the friendliest city in Europe by the SEA Tourist Commission.

Also noteworthy are the old coalmines of Zwartberg, Waterschei and Winterslag, surrounded by huge black mountains of dug up soil and coal remnants. Some of the mine buildings and housing can be visited.

The biggest tourist attraction of Genk is Bokrijk (Bokrijk), an open-air museum consisting of authentic relocated buildings (mainly dating from 17th till 19th century) from all over Flanders. In the summer season, historical Flanders comes alive in Bokrijk through numerous actors and re-enactment events.

In **Bokrijk**, life takes its course; it follows nature's rhythm. The morning sun pierces through the lush green foliage and conjures up a colourful light show on the Kempen square. The church bells ring and the windmill starts up slowly. The priest gets ready for a fire-and-brimstone sermon. And while the farmer and his wife warm themselves at the fire, the village constable patrols the village with a vigilant expression. The delicious scent of freshly baked bread at the local bakery delays the children on the way to school. Are you curious to see who will be required to wear the donkey's ears by the strict teacher today? And you... are right in the middle of it all!

### OTHER NICE CITIES IN BELGIUM



#### **BRUSSELS**

Brussels is the **capital city** of Belgium. It is a beautiful place with a thousand things to visit and to see .

**Belgian coast**: the Belgian coast is a 60 km long beach with white sands. You can visit very busy cities s.a. Ostend and Blankenberge. Or you can enjoy calm and friendly De Haan. Knokke and Nieuwpoort is more for the shopping-fan. If you want to eat fresh lobster, I have the right restaurant, at the coast, for you.
